



Appeals Procedure



You want to appeal a grade or a decision

Firstly, you must work out if you meet any of the following grounds, you **CANNOT** appeal a mark/decision you simply disagree with.

Do you meet either of these grounds?

- » At the time of the assessment, there were circumstances which adversely affected your performance **AND** which you were unable to communicate to the Examiners/Progression Panel before it reached its decision.
- » There was an administrative error OR procedural irregularity during the relevant assessment of such a significant nature as to have likely affected the approved grade or mark awarded.

Retrospective medical documents will not be accepted as valid.

Potential for informal resolution

Senior Leader will be asked if it can be solved informally. A written response will be requested on behalf of the relevant school, as well as any other relevant information for consideration. The School's response will then be sent to you, and you are able to make a further written submission, if you wish.

Considered by Academic Appeals Group:

The information gathered will be sent to the Academic Appeals Group for their consideration.

Outcome received from University: **NOT ELIGIBLE**

Appeals process ends.

UPHELD

Academic Appeals Group recommends reconsideration from the Board of Examiners/Award and Progression Panel.

Appeals process ends

NOT UPHELD:

It is deemed as not a case for successful appeal due to insufficient evidence

It is made against the academic judgement of the examiners, or made outside the deadlines, or for other good reason

Dissatisfied with outcomes

Do you meet any of these grounds for a review?

- » There was a procedural irregularity in how the University followed the academic appeals process formal stage
- » A consideration of whether the outcome was reasonable in all circumstances
- » There is new evidence which you were unable, for valid reasons, to provide earlier and which may affect the decision made by the Academic Appeals Group.
