What is a School Rep?

School Reps are students elected to represent everyone studying within their academic School at UoG. They use their experience as Course Reps and members of the Education and Community Sub-Council to make sure the views of their School are heard at Student Council.

There are three School Reps for each School:

- School of Education, Health and Science
- School of Business, Computing and Social Sciences
- School of Arts, Culture and Environment

What would I be doing?

As a School Rep, you'll:

- Represent the feedback and priorities of students in your School.
- Use your knowledge as a Course Rep to raise issues and ideas at Student Council.
- Work with other Reps, Officers and SU staff to improve the academic experience.
- Help shape SU campaigns and decisions that affect teaching and learning.

It's not a whole extra workload but you'll attend four Student Council meetings a year to make sure your School's voice is heard. It's a simple but meaningful leadership role that builds skills, influence and connection across the University.

You'll receive full training and ongoing support from the SU team to help you get the most out of the role.



How do I apply?

These roles are filled through an election – that means you'll need to nominate yourself and campaign for votes. Don't worry, we'll support you with guidance and training to help you along the way.

Glossary

Election – A formal process in which students vote to elect representatives for the Students' Union.

Candidate – An individual who is running for a position in the Students' Union election.

Nomination – The process by which students put themselves forward as candidates for election, often requiring a set number of signatures from fellow students.

Manifesto – A document outlining a candidate's policies, promises, and goals if they are elected.

Students' Union (SU) – The official body representing students at the university, responsible for student welfare, events, and advocacy.
