What is a Societies Rep?

Societies Reps are students elected to represent all student societies at UoG. They use their experience as Society Committee Members and members of the Activities and Opportunities Sub-Council to make sure the voice of societies is heard at Student Council.

There are four Societies Rep roles available.

What would I be doing?

As a Societies Rep, you'll:

- Represent the feedback and priorities of students involved in societies.
- Use your experience as a Society Committee Member to raise issues and ideas at Student Council.
- Work with other Reps, Officers and SU staff to improve the experience of running and being part of societies.
- Help shape SU campaigns and decisions that support community, inclusion and student life.

It's not an extra workload, you'll just attend four Student Council meetings a year to make sure the voice of societies is heard.

It's a simple but meaningful leadership role that builds skills, connections and influence across the University.



How do I apply?

These roles are filled through an election – that means you'll need to nominate yourself and campaign for votes. Don't worry, we'll support you with guidance and training to help you along the way.

Glossary

Election – A formal process in which students vote to elect representatives for the Students' Union.

Candidate – An individual who is running for a position in the Students' Union election.

Nomination – The process by which students put themselves forward as candidates for election, often requiring a set number of signatures from fellow students.
