## What is a Sports Rep?

Sports Reps are students elected to represent all sports clubs and teams at UoG. They use their experience as Club Committee Members and members of the Activities and Opportunities Sub-Council to make sure the voice of student sport is heard at Student Council.

There are four Sports Rep roles available.

## What would I be doing?

As a Sports Rep, you'll:

Represent the feedback and priorities of students involved in sport.

Use your experience as a Club Committee Member to raise issues and ideas at Student Council.

Work with other Reps, Officers and SU staff to improve the sporting experience for students.

Help shape SU campaigns and decisions that affect sport, health and student life.

It's not an extra workload; you'll simply attend four Student Council meetings a year to ensure the voice of student sport is heard. It's a simple but meaningful leadership role that builds skills, networks and influence across the University community.

You'll receive full training and ongoing support from the SU team to help you get the most out of the role.





## How do I apply?

These roles are filled through an election – that means you'll need to nominate yourself and campaign for votes. Don't worry, we'll support you with guidance and training to help you along the way.

## Glossary

Election – A formal process in which students vote to elect representatives for the Students' Union.

Candidate – An individual who is running for a position in the Students' Union election.

Nomination – The process by which students put themselves forward as candidates for election, often requiring a set number of signatures from fellow students.

Manifesto – A document outlining a candidate's policies, promises, and goals if they are elected.

Students' Union (SU) – The official body representing students at the university, responsible for student welfare, events, and advocacy.
