# Full-Time Officer Elections 2026

## What do I need to do to run for election?

### 1. There are a few key stages involved in standing for a full-time officer role:

- Choose Your Role - Decide what role you want to nominate yourself for. You can see all the details about the different roles here: [uogsu.com/roles](http://uogsu.com/roles).

### 2. Nominate Yourself

- Nominations Open: 29th January 2026 (10am)
- Nominations Close: 6th March 2026 (12pm)
- Visit [uogsu.com/nominate](http://uogsu.com/nominate) and select 'stand for election'.
- Submit your name and upload a headshot photo (choose one you like, it will be used throughout the election period!).

### 3. Write a Manifesto

- A manifesto is a short document that helps students understand who you are, what you aim to achieve, and how you plan to do it.
- Manifesto Submission Deadline: 11th March 2026 (12 pm)
- The best manifestos are clear, focus on around 3 key areas, and outline how you will implement changes.

### 4. Candidate Briefing: Rules & Regs

- Date: 11th March 2026
- This briefing is compulsory before you can start campaigning! It will go through all the do's and don'ts of the election.

## 5. Candidate Announcement

- Date: 13th March 2026 (9am)
- This is when the official candidate list is published.

## 6. Start Campaigning!

- Campaigning officially starts after the Candidate Announcement on 13th March.
- This is your chance to tell students why you are the best choice to represent them.

## 7. Hustings Event

- Date: 16th March 2026
- Hustings is a live Q&A and debate session where candidates answer questions from students.

## 8. Voting Period

- Voting Opens: 16th March 2026 (1 pm - Oxstalls Only)
- Voting Closes: 20th March 2026 (1 pm - all campuses)

## 9. Election Results Announcement

- Date: 20th March 2026
- The winners of the election will be announced!
