Main purpose of the job

- To represent the student voice at a variety of levels both within the Students' Union and the University of Gloucestershire.

- The role contributes to the shaping of all aspects of the student experience, both academic and non-academic. All student representatives are highly valued by the University, the Students' Union and the students they represent.

- Work closely with Academic Subject Leaders to ensure robust information exchange;

Main duties and responsibilities

- Work with staff and students to enhance and develop the student experience, in both in academic and non-academic areas

- Gather feedback from Course Reps on teaching methods and learning resources and work with relevant staff to respond to this feedback

- Develop methods to engage Course Reps with the Representation Scheme
- Promote the Student voice in appropriate committees/forums
- Communicate key information to the Course Reps

- Liaise with Students' Union and School staff, particularly Academic Subject Leaders and Heads of School

- Liaise with fellow Student Subject Coordinator

- Organise focus groups, working parties and other activities that will generate innovative ideas that will benefit students, looking at specific areas of the student experience

- Attend a group meeting with your Head of School, Academic Subject Leader, other SSC within your school on a six-week basis to ensure the smooth running of any SSC activities within the School

- Meet with Academic Subject Leader on a monthly basis to ensure robust information exchange; - Meet with SU Student Voice Manager, Student Voice and Campaigns Coordinator and Education

Officer on a monthly basis to ensure robust information exchange

- Act as the communication champion for the Reps system by effective utilisation of social media and the SU website

- Support the University and the SU in reviewing, creating and promoting enriching activities as part of the enhanced student year

Commitment

- 4 hours per week during term time

- Attend all training

- Attend an all Student Subject Coordinators' meetings every 4 weeks – 6 weeks

- Attend and actively contribute to Faculty Teaching and Learning Committees and, Course Board of Studies and other relevant committees
