## Union Believes

Why keeping discounting at UoG is important:

- Discounting recognises that students cannot be perfect all the time. It acknowledges that life happens, and one difficult module should not define a student's overall performance.
- In the current economic climate, many students cannot dedicate all their time to study. Rising living costs mean that a significant number of students must work alongside their course just to afford basic needs. While students put their full effort into their assignments, expecting consistently high performance across all 120 CATS is unrealistic and increases stress, worsens mental health, and may contribute to students withdrawing from university.
- A substantial proportion of UoG students face additional challenges. Around 20% of our students are disabled, whether that be a hidden disability or not and we have many mature students, student parents, student carers, and students working 20–30 hours per week. In addition, removing the 30-Credits unfair impact on neurodivergent students. The 30-credit flexibility offers these students essential breathing room and helps create a fairer, more inclusive assessment experience.

## Union Resolves

## What needs to happen

- 1. Have a united front with the university, which at Academic Board, the university agrees that discounting grades should not be gotten rid off
- 2. Have the relevant SU members research how to start a petition.
- 3. Have the Education and Community Officer, School reps and Course reps write the petition.
- 4. Have the relevant SU members gather sabbatical officers from other universities to communicate on this issue to see if they would support the petition.
- 5. Have the relevant SU members reach out to local MPs to try get their support on this matter and bring it to parliament.
- 6. Have the relevant SU members gather a set of data that supports what the union believes.
- 7. The relevant SU member and/or Education and Community officer will do an education piece which aims to spread awareness on what discounting is, how it works at UoG, what the Ofs report means and how will the Ofs report effect UoG students. School reps will do the same within their schools. SU will lobby to make

this information widespread through use of MyGlos and staff net
for lecturers to be aware.
