### **Election of Chair and Vice Chair**

The meeting began with the election of independent student councillors for Chair and Vice Chair roles, as required by SU bylaws. Full-time officers were not eligible to stand.

- Candidates:
  - Chair: NW
  - Vice Chair: EM, FD & AN
- Statements:
  - FD emphasised equal voice for all reps.
  - EM highlighted her advocacy experience and confidence in supporting students.
  - AN shared her background in youth advocacy and commitment to inclusivity.
- Voting Results:
  - Chair: NW elected unanimously (13 votes for, 0 against, 0 abstain).
  - Vice Chair: EM elected with 10 votes (FD received 4 votes, AN0).

Action: NW and EM to chair future meetings; DH to chair sections where both have conflicts of interest.

## **Officer Reports**

# **Activities & Opportunities - FR Rowley**

- Campaign: Fed Up promoting affordable cooking and healthy eating.
  - Two successful cooking classes held; more planned for February.
  - Partnerships with local charities (Wiggly, Gloucester Feed the Hungry) and restaurants for recipe sharing and food vouchers.
- Student Leader Accreditation: First session delivered; next scheduled for February.
- Team Glos Points: Positive engagement; thresholds to be lowered before Christmas. Domino's sponsorship being finalized for additional rewards.
- Movember: Raised significant funds; UoG ranked 1st in "More Modes, More Impact" challenge and 6th in distance challenge among 27 universities.

- Welcome Fair 2026: Discussion on venue Park vs Gloucester Arena. Park preferred in provisional vote, but Arena considered for weather-proofing and space. Wider student survey planned.
- Awards 2026: Plans to balance sports and society categories, improve food options, and introduce nomination booths.
- Policy Idea: Cap fundraiser ticket prices to reduce financial strain on students.

## **Education & Community - BH Holland**

- Campaign: Glos Bound connecting students to Gloucester through events and partnerships.
  - Passport initiative and Community Access Fund launched with City Council funding.
  - "Be With B" video series planned to promote free community activities.
- Course Rep Accreditation: High engagement; many reps have completed policy-writing criteria.
- Sub Council Updates:
  - ACE: Concerns about FCH future, Upper Quay accommodation issues, and course revalidation.
  - EHS: Room booking difficulties, nursing timetable challenges, proposal for "Apps Anywhere" to access licensed software remotely.
  - BCSS: Assessment bunching and limited study spaces highlighted.
- Major Issue: OFS proposal to remove grade discounting discussed extensively later in policy section.

# Welfare & Diversity - IJ (report delivered by DH)

- Campaign: Unmask promoting inclusivity and authentic student identity.
  - Initiatives include Wish Tree (247 wishes collected), Story Sharing Wall during Black History Month and International Students' Day, and collaborations with Hartpury SU.
- Priorities:
  - Expand inclusive events and story-sharing projects.l
  - ncrease international student participation in sports and societies.
  - Advocate for better accommodation experiences.

### **Sub Council Themes:**

- Inclusivity in clubs and societies.
- Accessibility of local venues for socials.
- Proposal for working group involving welfare, sports, and society reps to deliver inclusivity training.

## **Policy Discussion - OFS Discounting Proposal**

BH presented a policy opposing the OFS recommendation to remove grade discounting (currently UoG counts top 90 credits per year, allowing 30-credit leeway).

- Rationale:
  - Supports flexibility for students facing illness, disability, caring responsibilities, or employment.
  - 20% of UoG students are disabled; many are mature, parents, or carers.
  - Removing discounting risks grade inflation concerns, course closures, and reputational damage for post-92 universities.
- Union Believes:
  - Discounting is essential for fairness and accessibility.
  - OFS changes disproportionately harm smaller universities and underrepresented students.
- Union Resolves:
  - Launch petition and awareness campaign.
  - Collaborate with other universities and MPs (Gloucester MP already supportive).
  - Engage NUS and sector bodies.
  - Develop educational materials for students and staff.
- Amendments Added:
  - Highlight impact on neurodivergent students and both visible/hidden disabilities.

- Emphasise need for awareness and education for students and lecturers.
- Vote:
  - Policy with amendments passed (13 for, 0 against, 0 abstain; 3 abstentions due to conflict of interest).

# **Any Other Business**

- Catering feedback: Request to extend hot food service hours at Oxstalls cafeteria.
- Next meeting will be held in early February after sub councils.
- Minutes to be published on SU website within 5 working days.
